GENERAL SCHOOL INFORMATION

1. School Hours

The new school term will commence on **Friday, 2 January 2026** for the **Primary 1 students only**.



Refer to page 8 of this booklet for the First Day of School programme for P1s.

Morning Assembly will start promptly at 7.30 a.m. All students are strongly encouraged to report to the hall/classroom 15 minutes before the start of school to help them settle down and be prepared for the day's learning and activities.

Dismissal time is staggered for the different levels. **The dismissal time for the P1 students is scheduled at 1.30 p.m. on Monday to Thursday and 1.15 p.m. on Friday.**

2. Silent Reading – Students should have a storybook with them every day.

3. School Attire

Name-tags are required on **both** the school uniforms and the PE T-shirts. The name-tag is to be (sewn or using velcro) approximately 1.5 cm above the school logo. Students should wear their PE attire on days when they have PE Lessons; and when the Programme for Active Learning (PAL) is conducted. Six periods (1.5hr) each week is set aside for PAL lessons where your child will engage in different activities to learn socio-emotional competencies. We advise you to purchase sufficient sets of PE attire for this purpose.



P1 students will be wearing a **plastic name tag** for the first 2 weeks of school for easy identification and for staff to provide help when necessary. The name tag will be given out by the teachers on the first day of school.

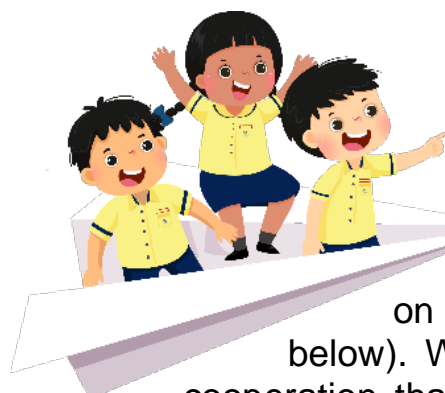
4. **Packing of School Bag**

Your child will be given a timetable by the Form/Co-form Teacher by the end of the first week of school. Please help your child learn to pack his/her bag and bring items/books according to the timetable **from 8 January 2026** onwards.

5. **Recess**

There is a buddy programme for the Primary 1 students. Our Primary 4 buddies will guide the Primary 1 students during recess from 5 January – 8 January 2026. The Form/Co-form teachers will also have recess with the Primary 1 students in week 1 to get to know them better.

Through this, we hope to teach our Primary 1 students to be independent during recess.

P1 Orientation Programme

1. In order to enthuse and excite our P1 students, we will be running a P1 Orientation Programme from 5 January – 12 January 2026.

Healthy Meals in Schools Programme

- The school has embarked on the Healthy Meals in Schools Programme (HMSP) since 2013. The canteen adheres to the guidelines and serves balanced meals to the students. The Healthy Set Meals consist of appropriate proportions of food from the four main food groups; rice/ noodles, meat, vegetables and a slice of fruit. The prices of the Healthy Set Meals and other kinds of food sold are provided in the table below. The recommended amount of daily pocket money is **\$2.50 - \$3.50**.

PARENT GATEWAY ONBOARDING GUIDE

Parents Gateway is a mobile app developed by MOE to support parents' involvement in their child's educational journey. The app enables parents to receive information from the school and perform a range of administrative functions, including granting consent for school programmes/activities, booking of Parent-Teacher Meeting slots and declaring travel plans during school terms.

Resources will also be shared to support parents and prepare your child for this transition, as well as provide important administrative instructions and announcements on the following:

- (i) the start of school preparation process
- (ii) the administrative requirements that need to be fulfilled in a timely manner
- (iii) your child's transition into P1 via the app.

To facilitate this, parents are encouraged to download the Parents Gateway app on your mobile phone (available on iOS and Android platforms only). Upon successful download, the app will guide you through a simple one-time onboarding process.

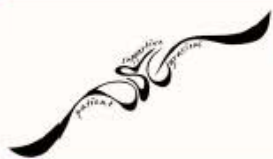
